





STAYING ALIVE

Preventing Serious Injury and Fatalities while Working at Height

- Supported by AIF
- First official inquiry launched January 2018
- Over 60 evidence submissions received
- Oral evidence taken in March and July 2018
- 'Staying Alive' report published February 2019

waiting to investigate why workers fall from height waiting to death and serious injury, and to come up with a set of recommendations to reduce the overall number of falls.

Recommendations

- The introduction of enhanced reporting without an additional burden, through RIDDOR, which at a minimum, records the scale of a fall, the method used and the circumstances of the fall.
- 2. The appointment of an independent body that allows confidential, enhanced and digital reporting of all near misses and accidents that do not qualify for RIDDOR reporting. The data collected by this independent body will be shared with government and industry to inform health and safety policy.
- The extension of the Working Well Together Working Well at Height safety campaigns to industries outside of the construction sector.
- An equivalent system to Scotland's Fatal Accident Inquiry process to be extended to the rest of the UK.
