POLAND



Um video do YouTube mostra oito mineiros que realizam a dança convulsiva. Um trabalhador despedido que não daria o nome dele disse ao jornal que até 15 pessoas foram demitidas, incluindo alguns que assistiram ao desempenho, mas não participaram.

Powered access is a safe way of working at height.

So why take a risk by not wearing a full body harness when using boom-type platforms?

There is a real risk of serious injury or death from being <u>catapulted</u> out of the basket.

You may not be in any position to avoid violent movement of the basket.

But correct use of a harness can prevent you from being thrown out.

Clunk Click is a worldwide campaign to encourage all users of boom type platforms to wear a full body harness with a short lanyard.

It was started in the UK by the Powered Access Interest Group (PAIG), a joint committee of the Construction Plant-hire Association and the International Powered Access Federation.



Technical Guidance Note H1/08/12 on:

Fall Protection in Mobile Elevating Work Platforms

Boom Type Platforms

When working from a boom type Mobile Elevating Work Platform (MEWP), it is strongly recommended that a full body harness with an adjustable lanyard be used to provide work restraint. The lanyard should be adjusted to be as short as possible and may contain an energy absorbing device.

This includes Static Booms (1b) and Mobile Booms (3b).



Vertical Lifts

It is not normally necessary for personnel working from a vertical lift to wear fall protection equipment, other than in exceptional circumstances.

This includes Static Verticals (1a), Mobile Verticals (3a), Push Around Verticals (PAV) and Mast Climbing Work Platforms (MCWP).

The need for a fall protection system will be the outcome of a job specific risk assessment undertaken prior to work commencing and taking into consideration the manufacturer's operators' manual.

IPAF BRINGS SAFETY TRAIL TO LAS VEGAS

IPAF's Lift Safety Zone at Conexpo in Las Vegas, US, debuts a "back to basics" safety trail using reallife MEWPs to demonstrate atrisk scenarios including: Unsafe ground; avoiding entrapment; avoiding electrocution; preventing unauthorised access; risk assessment; and pre-use inspections. IPAF also offers a comprehensive white paper on the forthcoming ANSI and CSA standards.

A campaign to attract new members co-ordinated by IPAF's new Turkey Representative Burcu Ünal sees membership grow by around 75% in a single year. Meanwhile ISO 18878 "Mobile Elevating Work Platforms – Operator (driver) training" is published by the Turkish Standards Institution.

The Italian language magazine IPAF-Informa is published in print and digital versions.





NEW IPAF PRESIDENT ADDRESSES SUMMIT

Nick Selley of AFI-Uplift is IPAF's new President, taking over from Andy Studdert for a two-year term at the IPAF Council AGM in London, UK, pictured right. He uses his inaugural address to call for the industry to create more apprenticeships. Brad Boehler, President of Skyjack, is elected as Deputy President and Riwal's Norty Turner as Vice President.

In total more than 450 industry professionals gather for the annual IPAF Summit and to honour the winners of the 2017 IAPAs at a gala event hosted by TV sport presenter John Inverdale. Among many worthy winners, pictured below right, Roger Bowden Chairman and founder of Niftylift UK, receives a Lifetime Achievement Award.

The following day IPAF delegates join escorted tours of Wembley Stadium, the redevelopment and maintenance of which involves extensive and innovative use of powered access equipment.

IPAF DEBUTS MEWP CONTROLS RESEARCH

APEX 2017 at the RAI centre in Amsterdam, Netherlands, is the perfect venue for IPAF to debut a MEWP controls test rig aimed at collecting data to assist with a long-running project aimed at standardising some MEWP controls, pictured top right.

Paul Roddis takes up post as IPAF's new Training Manager and is based in the UK office.

The IPAF Journal Germanlanguage magazine is published. The Vertikal Days event at Silverstone racetrack in the UK sees the launch of new MEWP safety guidance drafted by IPAF.

There are two new starters in IPAF's Singapore-based south-east Asia team, with Amanda Tan, pictured right with Raymond Wat, and Morgan Chang joining to support the upcoming IPAF Asia Conference in Changsha, China, as well as rapidly expanding membership and training demand in South Korea, China and Japan.

ASIA CONFERENCE SIGNS MASS HARNESS PLEDGE

More than 300 delegates from across Asia and further afield use their attendance at the IPAF Asia Conference in Changsha, China, to affirm their commitment to safety in the powered access industry by signing a pledge to equip all operators of boom-type MEWPs with an appropriate safety harness.

IPAF takes a stand for the first time at the popular Suisse Public municipal safety expo in Bern, Switzerland. Visitors are invited to test their knowledge in IPAF's "back to basics" safety trail.

IPAF also engages a web design agency to deliver a new global **www.ipaf.org** website that is set to go live early in 2018.

IPAF MEMBERS OFFER HELP TO LONDON MAYOR

Tim Whiteman, CEO of IPAF, writes to Mayor of London Sadiq Khan, pictured right, to express members' wishes to work with the emergency services in the wake of the Grenfell Tower fire. The tallest access platforms operated by the London Fire Brigade reach up to 32 metres; Grenfell Tower is 67 metres tall. The letter points out there are IPAF members in and around London with platforms that can reach up to 90 metres, and offers use of this specialist equipment and training support in future.

Chris Wraith, IPAF Technical & Safety Executive, is honoured by the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (RoSPA) in the UK for creating the Andy Access character and associated safety messages. Tim Whiteman, CEO of IPAF, says: "This award is well-deserved recognition for IPAF's team."

FATALITIES DECLINE AS RENTAL DAYS RISE

The fatal injury rate (FIR) for MEWPs declined in 2016, despite the fact that the total MEWP rental fleet and number of rental days worldwide increased significantly.

The data, exclusively collated by IPAF, indicate that in 2016 there were 66 reported fatalities involving MEWPs worldwide, compared to 68 deaths in 2015. During the same period, the size of the global MEWP rental fleet rose from an estimated 1.17 million units at the end of 2015 to 1.25m estimated at the end of 2016.


IPAF welcomes the updated British Standards regarding the safe use of MEWPs and MCWPs. The new British Standards 8460 and 7981 supersede the 2005 and 2002 versions respectively and include guidance on risk assessments, familiarisation and rescue plans.
